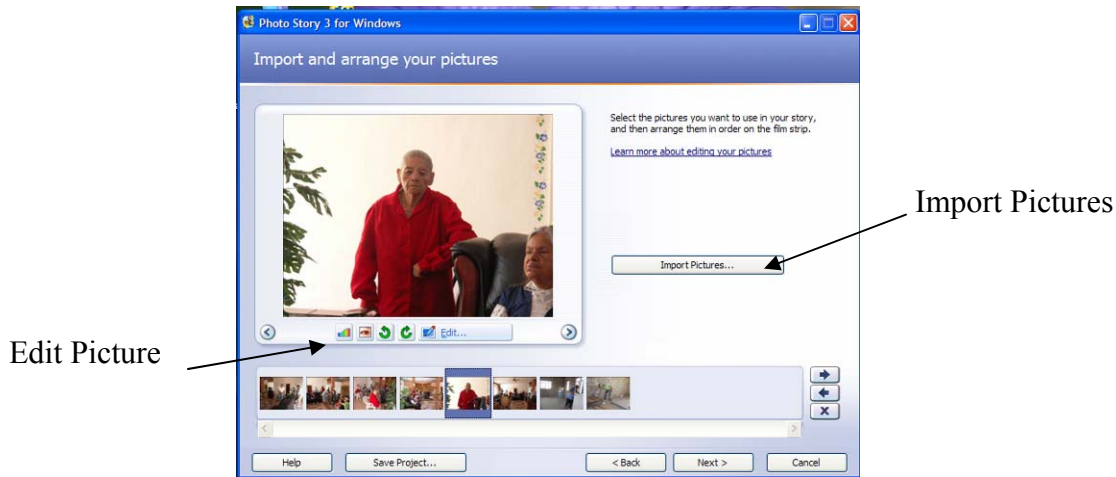


Photo Story 3

Basic Tutorial

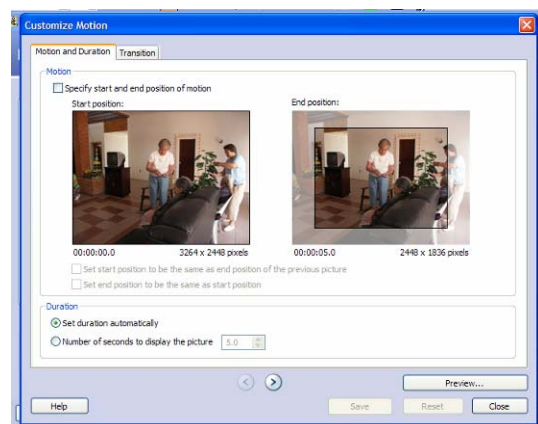
- Open the Photo Story 3 Panel
- Select "Begin a new story"
- Select "Import Pictures" (Locate the file or files for the pictures. Import all the pictures you want in the presentation.)



- Once all pictures are imported arrange them in the order that they are to appear. Simply click and drag to the right location
- The panel is also the screen to edit the picture. You can rotate (left and right), change the color, contrast, remove the red eye.
- After you have fixed all the pictures, click "Next"

- This screen you can place text on the photo. You have few choices, it is left, right, center or up, down, or center.
- Effects can be added to each picture on this screen.





- Once all the changes have been made, click "Next"
- This screen is the Narrate or Customize the motion screen.
- When you customize the motion, Photo Story will automatically assign settings. Or you can select "Specify start and end position of motion" You can choose where it begins and where it ends. You can alter the seconds assigned to this slide. The save and move to the next slide. After you have finished all the motions click "Close"
- Add your narration on this screen
- Choose "Next"
- Add the background music. "Select the music" Your

presentation may require the music to be loaded several times or load different songs. This is according to how long the presentation is.

- After you insert the music you should use "Preview" to view the presentation before make the video.
- Once you have previewed the presentation and everything is ok click "Next"
- Select the type of story you want
- "Save to play back on your computer" if the computer is the choice. (You can change the settings according to the size of the file.)
- Once you click "Next" it will make the movie.
